STV|DPM Golf Classic Crosses \$1M Milestone for National Multiple Sclerosis Society

*24th annual event raises more than \$89,000 and crosses \$1M mark in total
dollars raised since tournament inception*

NEWTON, Mass. The sellout tournament was held Monday, September 11th. The funds collected from 144 golfers, dinner attendees, sponsorships, and sale of raffle tickets and mulligans raised more than \$89,000, bringing the total amount of funds raised over the tournament's history to over \$1 million.

The women's longest drive was won by Cheryl Gielow of Workflow Interiors, the closest to the pin winner was Rich Elliot of Chapman Construction/Design, who came in at 12 inches.
